Councillor Albery reported that Somerset Council has requested details of the amount of time the Parish Council spends on its footpaths. He explained that most of the footpaths are within the village and the farmers look after the ones that are on their grounds and there had been no reports of footpaths needing attention.

Charlie Field in estates needs to be told about the ivy on a tree on the road up to Nightcott, this is deemed as unsafe and needs attention to stop it falling into the road, the Clerk will email him about this as Somerset Council have responsibility for the road.

23/174 REPORTS FROM COUNCILLORS

Councillor Nicholson reported that on the 20th February Somerset Council cut the devolvement of certain tasks to the Parish and Town Councils such as gully clearing and verge cutting. However, this is only a temporary measure and will be reviewed in due course.

The play area within the village, which the Parish Council pay a yearly rent of £25 for, is an asset they would like to devolve - the Clerk will now investigate this matter and will ask the main Council if the Parish Council can now take over this asset.

The Dulverton recycling centre is still being set for closure, however there was a lot of interest at the public meeting with people putting forward reasons for it to remain open.

The road works on the B3224, which has meant the closure of the road between Exford and Wheddon Cross, are still on track.
